Professional Driving – Best Practices

A professional driver needs to be properly trained to drive defensively with a positive attitude. This will result in fewer accidents and a driver who will then do all the other things right, on a consistent basis.

Top 10 Do's & Don'ts of Defensive Driving



1 Don't take chances. Stay out of it and avoid accidents

Always read the road signs, especially on freeways.

Emergency stops – pull off road altogether, moving as deep into the emergency lane as possible. Never stop near a sharp curve or below the crest of a hill. At night, keep your lights on.

2 Always expect the unexpected - be alert.

Nearly all accidents that occur are due to human error

8 Ensure all safety critical components are in working order, especially brakes.

9 Adjust driving to conditions of road, to the weather, to your physical condition and mental attitude.

10 Always drive defensively being prepared to counter other drivers' mistakes.

3 Even if you think you have the right of way, don't insist if the other driver tries to take the gap.

10 Train your drivers

4 Avoid driving in a group of vehicles. Separate yourself and create some space. Remember following distance.

5 Plan ahead when driving around towns. Check the least travelled route and avoid traffic and hazards.
